Editor's Message



A couple of Telegraph Key issues ago, I wrote about trying to get a good start on my layout and then trying to get a good re-start on my layout. Well, I have made progress since then. I came up with a fairly simple track arraignment that only utilizes four turnouts, serves two industries, contains a small runaround, and provides me the possibility of a future, lift-up staging area. It took a while to get this to a point where I

was satisfied enough with the operational aspects along with the overall "presentation" of the layout but I believe I achieved it.

Once everything seemed to be in the right place, I removed all the stand in structures and set them all aside on a nearby table. I then outlined the track with a black permanent marker and removed the track too. I knew that I wanted something to isolate the track from the foam insulation base because a locomotive and cars running across track that is mounted directly on foam will transfer that sound and get pretty noisy. I found some 1/8 inch self-stick rolls of cork online, ordered it, and put it in place. That's it... this is where I've gotten so far. But it is very far to me. I'm on a roll, so to speak, and I'm excited about my progress. I have told our SSR Convention planning team that I'd like to display my layout at our upcoming 2024 Convention in about a 50-70% form of completion and I'm pretty sure I can meet that goal.

Finally, you may have seen our Southern Division Superintendent's tag line in his monthly Telegraph Key updates. Bob Leonard signs off each month with "Until next month, Model 60!" It basically means to model at least 60 minutes a week - one hour out of 168. I'm taking his encouragement to heart and am having fun doing it. Have a great month of June everyone.



Achievement Program



The Sunshine Region has one AP for the month of May, **Robert Raymond** for **Chief Dispatcher** who is in the Eastern Division from Orlando, Florida.

Here is the way the Sunshine Region is going to handle Merit Judging for the Achievement Program.

The person who wants to have an item judged for Merit will send me pictures of the item (rolling stock 6 sides, structures 5 sides, scenery 6-8 photos, motive power 5 sides, prototype models 6-8 photos,) so I can preview the items to see if they rate Merit so as not to send Judges on a wild goose chase. If I think the item(s) is Merit worthy I will assign two judges from another Division to get with that person to have their models judged.

If the item to be judged is movable, the judging location will be somewhere near the middle of the distance between the people involved (Home Depot parking Lot, Walmart Parking Lot, Sam's Parking Lot, Lowes Parking Lot, or somewhere similar). If the item to be judged is not movable, then the judges will have to go to the place the item is at. I will notify the person that wants the judging to be done if I think the item is Merit quality and give them the phone numbers of the Judges and it will be their responsibility to coordinate with the judges for time and place. The Judges will be paid for all Gasoline that they have to use to travel by the Sunshine Region from the Achievement Program Budget.


